the deceiver of the whole world—he was thrown

and the kingdom of our God
and the authority of his Messiah,
for the accuser of our comrades has been thrown
down,
who accuses them day and night before our
God.
But they have conquered him by the blood of the
Lamb

SECOND READING

*A reading from St Paul's second letter to Timothy
(2:3-13)*

Share in suffering like a good soldier of Christ
Jesus. No one serving in the army gets entangled
in everyday affairs; the soldier's aim is to please
the enlisting officer. And in the case of an athlete,
no one is crowned without competing according
to the rules. It is the farmer who does the work
who ought to have the first share of the
crops. Think over what I say, for the Lord will give
you understanding in all things.

Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a
descendant of David—that is my gospel, for which
I suffer hardship, even to the point of being
chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not
chained. Therefore I endure everything for the
sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the
salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal
glory. The saying is sure:
If we have died with him, we will also live with
him;
if we endure, we will also reign with him;
if we deny him, he will also deny us;
if we are faithless, he remains faithful—
for he cannot deny himself.
