

# Shaping our future together

Since our last newsletter we have completed Phase 3 of our ongoing public consultation process about the HPC 60/60 project. In November, we launched an exhibition of the findings of Phases 1 & 2 at our Christmas Market, and this exhibition remained on public view in the church until February. A summary version of it has been touring around various places in Hornsey. We also have a new HPC 60/60 logo which communicates something of our vision as we look to the past to help inspire the future at Hornsey Parish Church.

We have met with a whole succession of interested groups, including Haringey Council planning officers, residents' associations and the Diocese of London. The very useful feedback we received has challenged and inspired us, and certainly has helped to inform an ever-deepening and more refined brief for our architects, Wimshurst Pelleriti. We are now documenting Phase 3 and updating our website, and all the feedback we have received is being considered by our Development Group as we await the formal response to our Pre-Application meeting with Haringey planners, prior to further, more detailed design work by the architects.

Looking ahead, the Development Group will be adding more information to the website, including regular responses to Frequently Asked Questions arising from the consultation activities.
