As we approach 2019, 60 years since the completion of our church, Hornsey Parish Church is faced with a similar threat to its viability. Our community spaces in the church hall are rapidly coming to the end of their useful life, and the church building is showing its age.

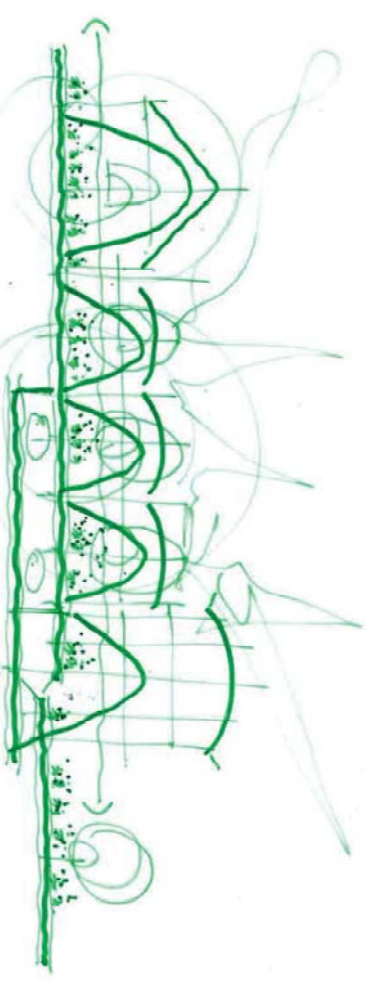


Confident

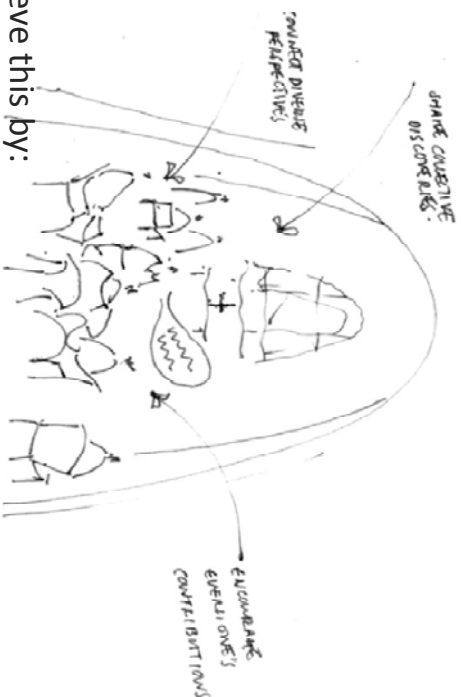
