### During May half term come to Kidspace in

**Romford!** Kidspace is an award-winning indoor adventure playground, the Metro describes it as "the Rolls-Royce of children's play areas". Adults can sit in a comfortable seating area while children enjoy the warehouse-sized fun emporium, with cargo nets, tunnels, vertical mazes, rope bridges, and gigantic slides; not to mention the two climbing walls or Thunderdome City—a padded area with sponge-ball- firing cannons! And for under 5's, there is a Toddler Village with climbing frame, slides, mazes and mini- trampolines and multisensory room.

**When: Tuesday, 29th May.** We'll meet at Hornsey Station at 12.30 and return at approximately 5.30. Cost of entry: £3 per adult; £9 per accompanied child; £11 per unaccompanied child for those who can afford this; if not, please just let us know and come anyway! Travel: We will travel together by train and tube—by far the cheapest way to do this is by individual Oyster card, with your child (even primary school children) having his/her own Zip Oyster card; this way, the adult fare will be £2.90 each way and each child will pay a total fare of £1.50.

**YOU NEED TO SIGN UP AND PAY BY SUNDAY, 13 TH MAY.** This will enable us to get advance rates, keep our costs down, and plan for how many adult staff we need to look after your children. Children will wear socks in the main play area but will need sturdy, enclosed shoes (such as trainers) for the climbing frame and high ropes. There is a café with reasonably-priced food and drink (no outside food or drink is allowed).

### Week of Accompanied Prayer

This year our Week of Accompanied Prayer takes a different form as we join Thy Kingdom Come, a global wave of prayer which invites Christians around the world to pray for more people to come to know Jesus Christ. This Church of England initiative has grown into an international and ecumenical call to prayer and we encourage you to make this week a week of committed daily prayer, guided by the special Thy Kingdom Come Novena - copies in church.

*A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (11:1-11)*

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, 'Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?' Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, 'I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, "Get up, Peter; kill and

eat." But I replied, "By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth." But a second time the voice answered from heaven, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane." This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were.
